UPDATE: Additional Arrests in Riley Elementary School Burglary

Today, Leon County Sheriff's Office Property Crime Unit made additional arrests in the Riley Elementary School burglary investigation. Klamentary Baker 13, JaNae Isom 14, Jamichael Baker 15, and Lenoris Miller 20, were arrested today without incident for their involvement in the incident.

With these arrest, all known suspects have been taken into custody.

Klamentary Baker (13 years old) – Burglary, Criminal Mischief with Damage Over \$1000

Lenoris Miller (20 years old) – Burglary, Criminal Mischief with Damage Over \$1000, Petit Theft

On January 3, 2017, the Leon County Sheriff's Office began investigating a burglary and criminal mischief at Riley Elementary School. Approximately \$40,000 worth of Leon County School property was damaged during the incident.

Through subsequent investigation detectives were able develop information identifying several different suspects. Today, LCSO detectives arrested Anthony Holley 14, Jaloni Bryant 14, and Keshawn Robinson, for Burglary and Criminal Mischief with Damage

over \$1000 (felony). All three are current students in the Leon County Schools. They were taken into custody without incident.

Sheriff Walt McNeil stated, "I want to thank our deputies for their quick response to this incident. These are very serious crimes that have allegedly been committed by multiple youths in our community. These young teenagers must understand that damaging our schools is not a prank, it's a crime! Working with their families and other members of the community like Rev. Ferguson, we must do all we can to prevent this type of behavior before it escalates."
